- Alert employees about cyber threats and how to protect business data.
- Establish Internet security policies, procedures, and practices to safeguard sensitive information.
- Require employees to use strong passwords and change them regularly.
- Use encryption technologies to protect data, invest in data loss protection software, and use two-factor authentication where possible.
- Protect all pages on your public-facing websites; not just the checkout and sign-up pages.
- Use an offsite Cloud Service for data backup and storage. This is the BEST method for your business to quickly recover from a cyber threat.
